Abstracts will have to be prepared in English and should include following information: presenting author's affiliation, e-mail, list of authors, title, objectives, materials and methods, conclusions. Authors should indicate their preference of a poster, oral or video presentation.

All presentations and additional media files have to be delivered to the preview room at least one hour before their session for final check. Speakers whose presentation is during the first session in the morning are asked to hand in their slides the day before. The room is available for speakers convenience throughout the meeting.

When reviewing the presentation in the preview, make sure all fonts, images and animations appear as expected and all audio or video clips are working properly.

Transport

Transport by bus and train: Warsaw Chopin Airport is located within a distance of 10 kilometers from the city centre if Warsaw. The Congress Venue is located 25 minutes from Chopin Warsaw Airport. Warsaw Chopin Airport is conveniently connected with the centre of Warsaw and major railway and bus stations: S2, S3 SKM (All trains S3 provide direct access in to the Warsaw Central Station or adjacent Warsaw City Centre station) and bus line 175 and N32 (night line). Trains and bus operate approximately every 20-15 minutes (5-10 minutes - in rush hour). Stops near the Warsaw Chopin Airport Congress venue are situated in Zone 1 of the ticket tariff. ZTM tickets on the airport premises can be bought at the Passenger Service Centre in the arrival hall, from ticket vending machines located at bus stops and by the entrance to a railway station, from ticket vending machines in SKM trains and in some buses, in a bus from a driver.
